An Annual Message From PASTOR AWE

BUT I HAVE A GOOD REASON!

"The man said, 'The woman whom You gave to be with me, she gave me fruit of the tree, and I ate" (Genesis 3:12).

2020 certainly will go down in the record books! It definitely has been a year where everyone was given so many reasons to "be safe" and to "be careful." In fact, we have found ourselves infected and hurting as we suffered in fear, wondering what was going to happen. And like Adam, in Eden, we found ourselves hiding out of paranoia and fear. But, just like every year of our lives on earth, we have found ourselves infected from the pandemic of sin.

Sin, not COVID-19, has separated us from one another and from God. We, much like Adam in Eden, have made up one reason or another to help us feel better for staying away from God. We have fearfully not trusted that God can forgive us all of our sins. So, like Adam, we point fingers at others and at God to cast blame away from ourselves for the disease of sin that has gripped us so tightly. We have blamed the Pastor, the people of Hope, a disease, a family member, "the woman that You gave me" to make excuse for our sinfulness. And in sinfulness, our "reasons" have honestly become excuses to help us with a false sense of safety and security.

Separation from God is the direct result from sin. It is not a disease or another individual or any other excuse that we can muster up to give us that false sense of security. No, my friends, Scripture is quite clear: it is sin! There are no reasons or excuses that keep me away from God and His Word and Sacrament except it is my sin.

Thanks be to God in Jesus Christ that He did not make any excuses. He kept His Word and came into this sinsick world and suffered and died for my sins — all of my sins. The only thing that should ever keep us away from God is ... NOTHING! "What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare His own Son but gave Him up for us all, how will He not also with Him graciously give us all things? Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died — more than that, who was raised — who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword? As it is written, 'For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered.' No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us. For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:31-39).





Pastor Flo's Yearly Report

I have been with you all for a little over a year and a half now and I continue to enjoy seeing how God is at work through all of us to serve our neighbors and share the good news of forgiveness and salvation freely offered through Jesus Christ our Lord. In spite of some very unique challenges through 2020, our relationships with some special Hispanic neighbors (children and adults) have been deepened, their knowledge of God's Word has increased, and the reputation of La Iglesia Luterana Esperanza (Hope Lutheran Church) as a safe place with pastors and people that genuinely care has spread. Below, you will find a few highlights from our 2020 monthly newsletters.

- 1. March 2020 Working Together to Serve a Sister This month, we were all blessed as we came together as a community, cooked and ate lots of waffles and sausage, and raised funds to help Carmen with her cancer treatment costs. The event was a wonderful bridge between our Anglo and Hispanic communities as we all worked together to serve our sister Carmen. Our expectations for the waffle breakfast fundraiser were surpassed with 30 volunteers, \$2,369 raised, and close to 300 participants.
- 2. April Never Assume We Know Over the last couple months, I've been visiting Yessenia, a neighbor from Mexico. We met by knocking on her door, introducing ourselves, and asking what needs she saw in the community. She was very open to conversation and said she'd like to talk more. In the following weeks, I stopped by once in a while to visit, to ask how her family was doing, and to share a short prayer or devotion with her. This month, Yessenia, Alberto, and their grandson, Rocky, visited Hope for the first time. During the Bible study, Alberto surprised us all when he said, "This is the FIRST time in my life that I've held a Bible in my hands and read from the Word of God." He's a lifelong nominal Catholic who seemed very skeptical the first time we met. We'll see what God has in mind for the future. Never assume we know!
- 3. May-June <u>Times that Challenge</u> The pandemic is now in full swing. Since people are at home, we're thinking of better ways to reach them at home. We've formed a WhatsApp group (a messaging service very popular throughout most of the world). We now have nearly 30 people in our group receiving daily audio and video devotions. We've never met most members of the group in person, so it's been a good way to pave the way for new connections and relationships. This month, I've also been asked by a community leader to be the primary contact person for "Community Response," a resource for individuals and families looking for help. I pray this will lead to many new connections and an increased reputation as "the church who speaks our language and is here to serve."
- 4. July Keep On Keepin' On- This month at a conference, I met a man named Ramon who lives close to Lincoln. He's originally from Venezuela where he was, believe it or not, catechized and confirmed in the faith by our very own Pastor Henry Witte. How wonderful to see the fruits of our labor from years past! This is a good reminder to think long term as we continue our ministries! Additionally, Valia and her son, Leandro, are from Cuba. They first came to visit us after a simple invitation from their neighbors, who are members of Hope's English-speaking congregation. Valia has visited our Sunday evening service in Spanish for months now and recently asked me to visit

them in their apartment every Thursday for a Bible study. It's beautiful to see how Valia's growing faith leads to such a desire to learn God's Word.

- 5. August Slow and Steady- After receiving about 3 calls every day for weeks through Community Response, we have been able to connect many families with financial aid, food, and other community organizations offering help. As I help them fill out the applications over the phone or in person, I have the opportunity to introduce myself and our "Iglesia Luterana Esperanza" (Hope Lutheran Church). In addition to the physical needs, many ask me to pray for them. Some ask for a visit to their homes. I have started a new weekly study with Juana and her son, Cristofer, from El Salvador as a result of these connections. The organization has now asked me to be a member of their board of directors. We will see what new connections and opportunities this leads to. Slow and steady!
- 6. September-October One Year with Siouxland Hispanic Ministry! It's hard to believe I've already been with you all for a full year! As we continue to build relationships with our Hispanic neighbors and share the Good News of all that Jesus, as their Lord, has done for them through His life, death, and resurrection, God's own Spirit will call them through that same Gospel, enlighten them with His gifts, make them holy and keep them in the true faith—just as He has done for you and me and for Christians of all times and places. That's our God's way of doing things. In these months, we also came together as a community and raised funds for our Hispanic Ministry. With the help of our very courageous Pastor Mike Awe and his crazy hairdos, we raised over \$5000! Thanks to Hope Lutheran for supporting our Hispanic ministry!
- 7. November-December Looking Further Ahead and The Message EVERYONE Needs Facing the challenge of integrating our Anglo and Hispanic brothers and sisters in the faith has led us to start a new event—Faith, Fun, and Food —every Saturday morning from 9 to 12 a.m. With the help of many volunteers, the kids come together for three hours: one hour of Bible stories and catechism work; one hour of activities; and one hour for lunch. They are formed in the Christian faith together and they have fun together. Additionally, our local YMCA has started a community education program and they've asked me to share my story with our Spanish speakers and to help with the ESL classes. This will be yet another way of getting connected to our Hispanic neighbors in our Siouxland community. This month, we also had a special potluck/Divine Service in Spanish for Reformation Sunday. The food was delicious, we had a few visitors who had the chance to hear the Gospel proclaimed, and it also happened to be Carmen's birthday!

Hispanic Ministries Committee – Year End Review

The year of 2020 has been challenging for the HMC. Our committee meets monthly and our Siouxland Hispanic Ministry group meets quarterly.

We at Hope Lutheran and the Siouland Hispanic Group have had Pastor Flo with us for over a full year now. We were blessed that the good Lord matched us up with Pastor Flo. He continues to work with Pastor Witte to go spread our goal in missions for the Hispanic community in the Siouxland area.

We started the year with a Waffle Fund Raiser for one of our own Hispanic members of Hope who was diagnosed with Cancer, Carmen Ortega. The entire church donated their time and food/paper products, which made our waffle cooking fun and entertaingin. With 30+ helpers serving approximately 300 guests we were able to raise \$2,369 to help with her medical expense and personal needs.

COVID set in and there were so many changes inside and outside of the church. This put a large strain on our guests and members, but we have worked through this difficult time thus far. We had several guest speakers this year from the Siouxland area to talk about their life and about living with or being a part of the Hispanic community.

Pastor Flo continues to visit all the Siouxland churches for both the Nebraska District and the Iowa West District. We are starting to see results in donations from more than just our neighborhood.

This next year we plan to expand the teachings within the Hispanic Community by spreading the Good News about our Lord Jesus Christ. We believe that if we get the youth involved, then the adults and parents will follow. We will continue to have "Faith, Food & Fun", and put up a basketball hoop outside with an area to shoot around.

With the Siouxland Hispanic group, we will contintue to receive ideas from the whole Siouxland area and representatives from their churches to provide positive constructive ideas on how to reach the Hispanics and get them through our church doors.

We need to be spending more time with knocking on doors, trying to build personal relationships, one on one visits, while providing informative handouts. Donations continue to be a major push this new year also, as low contributuions were received, our Hispanic funds ran short toward the end of the year. We have forunatley started 2021 on a good note with a couple of larger donations from other congrehation church members that Pastor Flo has visited. They are listening to our need for donations to keep our Hispanic Ministry moving forward.

STEWARDSHIP BOARD

Annual Report 2020

The Stewardship Board and Pastor Awe continued the stewardship program that was begun in 2019. The program was entitled Life At It's Best. In review the program was designed to teach us that giving of our time and talents is a part of our faith and puts our faith into action to support our ministries at Hope. Time and Talent sheets were also distributed to the congregation during a Sunday service on February 26,2020. They were completed at the time and we collected them as part of the service. Late this year our chairman Tom Gesell retired from his job and he and his wife moved to Fremont, NE. Tom recently advised us that he has transferred his church membership to Trinity Lutheran Church in Fremont. Vern Cummins also resigned from the Board on July 21, 2020 and indicated he would remain as part of the Board until the end of December. That will leave just two members on the Stewardship Board and they are in need of replacements. If you have been thinking about being on a Board this would be a great time to become part of our Stewardship Board or any of our other Boards as well.
